Disability Resource Library at the Center for Disabilities and Development (CDD)

The Disability Resource Library at the Center for Disabilities and Development (CDD) is newly relocated to a "front and center" space in the CDD lobby. Situated on the University of Iowa medical campus, we are funded by CDD (Iowa's University Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities) to serve as a full-service state-wide lending library on disability information. In 2011, we welcomed visits and inquiries from individuals in 62 Iowa counties covering every corner of the state and a wide swath of interior counties. Our collection of 5,000 items includes books, magazines, DVDs, training kits, and educational assistive technology. The library's software/hardware lending library allows patrons the opportunity to try out portable assistive technology at home before investing in expensive equipment. The current favorite is no surprise: the iPad, loaded with communication apps.

Home delivery is available for almost every item in our catalog. We lend to Iowans, without charge, for a three week interval; the only cost to borrowers is postage on mail returns. Online visitors can peruse the library catalog via the Programs and Services section of the CDD website: <http://www.uihealthcare.org/cdd/>. You can set up an account with us and order by e-mail. Phone orders are welcome as well and we will ship your items the next day. Contact us at 1-800-272-7713.

Over time, we will be building new training stations and adding a collection of therapeutic home trial toys "prescribed" by our clinicians. UIHC Patients' Library celebrates 80 years

The University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics (UIHC) Patients' Library will celebrate its 80th year in style during National Library Week, April 8th through 14th. The library occupies approximately 1200 square feet of newly renovated space on the 8th floor of the Colloton Pavilion. The prime location of the library in the Joyce Summerwill Patient and Visitor Activities Center has served to reinforce the importance of patients and families in the library's mission. The renovation allowed the library to create a welcoming glass entrance which entices patients and families to come in and explore the many recreational and educational resources.

A large flat screen TV complete with X-Box 360 Kinect, Playstation 3, and Wii, is balanced by the ability to access the TiGR on-demand patient education system. The twelve computer workstations available to patients, families, staff, and volunteers also connect to the closed circuit TV allowing access to the TiGR system – and the 4 Swank movie channels (one in Spanish) featuring new family friendly movies.

In addition to the excellent diversion resources, the new library now offers more private space for researching and providing consumer health information and patient education. The greatest achievement of the renovation is the inclusion of the first UIHC Patient Education Center. This room features the Intel Reader, Health Literacy Advisor software, and medical resources including atlases, dictionaries, PDR, along with other resource directories, and a virtual library of medical reference books.
